To be effective, 988 needs to forward callers to the local call center based off of pinging physical location, not by area code. This is particularly true for access to mobile crisis services - people won't be able to get access to mobile crisis services unless they can reach the mobile crisis dispatch center that dispatches mobile teams where the client physically located. In the areas where we currently provide mobile crisis services, the caller requesting a mobile team had an out-of-area area code in about 25% of cases
