Many of these individuals could not receive appropriate crisis care prior to arrest- I think the data of how crisis receiving centers and appropriate crisis response systems impact those numbers will be very important.

09:38:35 From Nikhil Seshan : this is based on a triangulation between claims analysis (we looked nationally at the number of ED visits for BH crises and the number of IP stays) and locus data from RI's previous work in Georgia

People are seeing this as a mapping from the current NSPL to a shorter number..

Linda - that is correct, this is all post-call crisis healthcare cost. We have a note at the bottom of the right hand chart saying "Note: Potential cost is limited to healthcare and does not include costs that may be incurred by other systems."

09:41:03 From Kenneth Minkoff : Thanks, Nikhil...I think you should highlight that assumption, and potentially make it modifiable. In our experience looking at EDs that are at baseline, modal hospitalization rates are much lower (20-50%), because the ED becomes the equivalent of a walk in urgent care center for people with less emergent need, so a large percentage of the BH ED visits are discharged home.
