Many of our IDD callers for help do actually need an option for inpatient/ residential respite - but MOST mental health facilities have exclusionary criteria for persons with IDD, Autism, and/or non-verbal. This seems to be a violation of the ADA - is Disability Rights or the Arc working on this issue?
