Many clinicians who work in the ED (not all are emergency physicians) feel that patients with mental health crisis are not a time sensitive emergency . Those who are trained in EM understand the urgency of crisis but are often pulled away for trauma, stroke, etc. However where the time sink really comes is when we are waiting for the next step. We see the patient, establish that they need a mental health consult but that can literally take hours if not in some cases a day or more. But then the real time problem occurs, waiting for a bed for the patient. The AVERAGE time for that is 10 HOURS.
