

SENATE LABOR, HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES FY 2024 APPROPRIATIONS BILL

SENATE BILL SPECIFICS

- Provides \$117 billion to the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS), which is level with the FY23 enacted level and \$12.2 billion below the President's Budget Request.
- Funds SAMHSA at \$7.55 billion, which is \$40m above the FY23 level.
- Specific line items include:
 - 988 Lifeline \$519.6m, a \$18m increase over FY23.
 - Mental Health Crisis Response Grants \$20m, level with FY23.
 - Mental Health Block Grant \$1.042b, a \$35m increase over FY23, and continues 5% crisis set-aside.
 - Certified Community Behavioral Health Clinic (CCBHC) grants - \$400m, a \$15m increase over FY23.

COMPARING TO THE HOUSE

& NEXT STEPS

- The House Provides \$103.3 billion to the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS),which is \$14 billion (12%) below the FY23 enacted level and \$25.9 billion below the President's Budget Request. and funds SAMHSA at \$7.1 billion, a cut of \$234 million below the FY23 Level.
- Further information on individual programmatic funding levels will be available when committee report is released in advance of the full committee markup.
- If all 12 bills aren't signed into law before 2024, 1% sequestration goes into effect.
- FY24 begins on October 1.
